INSPEC²T presented at the TRILLION project's 5th General Assembly



The INSPEC²T project was presented during the TRILLION project's 5th General Assembly on 5th September in Athens, Greece.

On 5th September 2016, representatives from KEMEA, INTRASOFT, and Lancashire Constabulary presented the INSPEC²T project at the TRILLION project's 5th General Assembly. The event held at the Technological University of Piraeus, Athens, Greece brought together 25 Consortium Partners from 8 countries.

The event provided an opportunity for the sister projects (both INSPEC²T and TRILLION were funded under the same call: FCT – 14 – 2014: Enhancing cooperation between law enforcement agencies and citizens – Community policing) to network and discuss future collaborations with each other.

INSPEC²T's partners delivered presentations on the project progress with KEMEA (the project coordinator) providing an overview of the project. Special emphasis was given to informing the TRILLION consortium members about the past clustering activities initiated by INSPEC²T. In the first instance, two events involved the participation of the UNITY project (the first INSPEC²T Stakeholders Advisory Group and External Experts Group workshop and the UNITY Consortium meeting) and secondly the INSPEC²T second Stakeholders Advisory Group and External Experts Group workshop in London where the UNITY, TRILLION and CITYCoP projects were present.

Following KEMEA's presentation, INTRASOFT showcased the technical approach of the INSPEC²T project in terms of the **Public Portal** and the **Serious Games** applications: **Resource Force** and **Crime Spotters**. Lancashire Constabulary introduced the INSPEC²T test cases.



Following the INSPEC²T presentations, a discussion followed between the presenters and the representatives of the TRILLION consortium, covering issues related to the two projects' technical approaches. Dr. Sofia Tsekeridou answered several questions from the TRILLION consortium members focused on the technical solution, whereas Inspector Sue Swift discussed aspects of the INSPEC²T test cases. Moreover, the discussion evolved into the benefits expected through the forthcoming clustering activity between the two sister projects, which will take place in November 2016 in the Netherlands.

The representatives of both the INSPEC²T and TRILLION projects underlined once more the importance of further enhancing the combined clustering efforts among all projects funded under the same call.
